CALL FOR TUTORIALS

Proposals for half/full day tutorials are also solicited based on the NTMS topics. Tutorial proposals should identify the intended audience and outline the scope and the depth of material to be covered. Past experience and successes of the presenter should be given explicitly and will be considered positively. We are particularly interested in tutorials that foster knowledge exchange among the researchers present at NTMS 2009.

CALL FOR WORKSHOPS

Workshop proposals should provide sufficient information to evaluate the quality and importance of the topic, the goals of the workshop, and the size of the interested community. Proposals should identify one or more chairs – and several other individuals willing to serve on an organizing committee and assist with publicity and reviewing. Proposals should be 2-4 pages and contain at least the description, goals, organizers and potential participants.

PROCEEDINGS & SPECIAL ISSUES

All accepted papers will be published in the **IEEE Xplore**. The best papers of the Mobility Track will be considered for publication in Journal of Computer Systems, Networks, and Communications, Special issue on WiMAX, LTE and WiFi Interworking.
